On October 2, 1950 seven newspapers, including the Seattle Times, the Washington Post and the Chicago Tribune ran the very first Peanuts comic strip written and illustrated by Charles M. Schulz. The strip and its associated books, merchandise and television specials earned its creator over one billion dollars. Lucy, Linus, Snoopy and, of course, Charlie Brown are American icons. The comic strip ran until February 13, 2000, the day after Shultz died. His work has been translated into 21 languages.

Columbus Day is a U.S. holiday that commemorates the landing of Christopher Columbus in the Americas in 1492. It was unofficially celebrated in a number of cities and states as early as the 18th century but did not become a federal holiday until 1937. Originally observed every October 12, it was changed to the second Monday in October beginning in 1971. For many, the holiday is a way of both honoring Columbus' achievements and celebrating Italian-American heritage. But throughout its history, Columbus Day and the man who inspired it have generated controversy, and many alternatives to the holiday have been proposed since the 1970's including Indigenous Peoples' Day.

Did you know? Contrary to popular belief, most educated Europeans in Columbus' day understood that the world was round, but they did not yet know that the Pacific Ocean existed. As a result, Columbus and his contemporaries assumed that only the Atlantic lay between Europe and the riches of the East Indies.

OCTOBER 21ST IS NATIONAL PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE DAY!



Ingredients

- -2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened
- -1/2 cup white sugar
- -1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- -2 eggs
- -1 (9 inch) prepared graham cracker crust
- -1/2 cup pumpkin puree
- -1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- -1 pinch ground cloves
- -1 pinch ground nutmeg
- -1/2 cup frozen whipped topping, thawed

Directions

-Preheat oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C).

-In a large bowl, combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Beat until smooth. Blend in eggs one at a time. Remove 1 cup of batter and spread into bottom of crust; set aside.

-Add pumpkin, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg to the remaining batter and stir gently until well blended. Carefully spread over the batter in the crust.

-Bake in preheated oven for 35 to 40 minutes, or until center is almost set. Allow to cool, then refrigerate for 3 hours or overnight. Cover with whipped topping before serving.

OCTOBER IS **FALL CAR CARE** MONTH!

Getting your vehicle ready for winter while temperatures are still mild is a proactive approach to preventive maintenance that helps ensure safety, reliability & fewer unexpected repairs when severe winter weather strikes. The



non-profit Car Care Council recommends 10 basic maintenance procedures during Fall Car Care Month in October to keep your vehicle operating at its best.

- 1.) Check all fluids, including engine oil, power steering, brake & transmission, as well as washer solvent & antifreeze.
- 2.) Check the hoses & belts to make sure they are not cracked, brittle, frayed, or loose.
- 3.) Check the battery & replace if necessary. Make sure connections are clean, tight & corrosion-
- 4.) Check the brake system annually & have the brake linings, rotors & drums inspected at each oil
- 5.) Inspect the exhaust system for leaks, damage & broken supports/hangers.
- 6.) Check engine performance to make sure it is delivering the best balance of power & fuel economy & producing the lowest level of emissions.
- 7.) Check the heating, ventilating & air conditioning (HVAC) system as proper performance is critical for interior comfort & for safety reasons such as defrosting.
- 8.) Inspect the steering & suspension system including shocks, struts, chassis parts & other related
- 9.) Check the tires, including tire pressure & tread wear.
- 10.) Check the wipers & lighting so that you can see and be seen.
